

AWS BOARD MINUTES NOVEMBER 21, 2024

Meeting Called to order 10:37am by President Judy Goldberg.

<u>Members Present:</u> Judy Goldberg, Gail Mardfin, Fran Nielsen, Lonna Necker, Linda L. Reid, Merrie Krisl, Judy Boles, Deni Marrone, Susan Nestor, Judy McFarland, Lorraine Stribling, Patricia Marina, Patty Bird, Judy Pagnusat, Carol Mills, Allene Donato

Discussion:

- <u>Sebastopol Center for the Arts (SCA)</u>: A meeting is to be held today at 2:30 to discuss the contract for 2025. We will request to pay quarterly. The contract should be ready by next week.
- <u>Community Funds Grant</u>: Carol Mills reported that the grant request has been accepted at \$500, which is half the amount granted last year. This is funded by the Sonoma County Transient Occupancy Tax, with the aim at promoting tourism.
- Holiday Party: The annual Holiday Party will take place on December 19th. Instead of the minimasterpiece raffle with tickets sold, a mini artwork exchange will take place for those who want to participate. The hope is that people will get to know each other better by sitting with someone they know and someone they don't know. Carol Mills has holiday decorations to share. Carol and volunteers will begin decorating around 11:15. The luncheon is Noon to 2:30. All attendees should bring a potluck dish to share, for 8-10 people, and should attach a tag telling what the dish is and ingredients. Paper plates and plastic utensils will be available, but people are encouraged to bring their own reusable place setting to help the environment. Lorraine Stribling will accept AWS dues if paid in cash or by check. No credit cards.
- Annual Overstock Sale: This event has been moved from the Holiday Party to the January meeting. Carol Mills and several other volunteers will be accepting donations at an intake table from 11:30 to Noon. The sale will begin at Noon and continue to 12:30 when the meeting starts. Sales continue between the meeting and the presentation, then again after the presentation. All sales must be cash or check, no credit cards. All sales are for the benefit of AWS. Anything not sold can be taken home. Anything still remaining will be donated to SCA for their children's program.
- <u>Presentations and Prompts:</u> Lonna Necker reported that today's presentation is Robert Benson. There will be no presentation or art sharing in December. January's presentation will be about watercolor and Masa paper given by Gail Mardfin. The prompt for January will be "Diversity".
- **Medical Exemptions**: Regarding attendance and food requirements for participation in the Apple Blossom Show, two medical exemptions were approved.
- Treasurer: ·Merrie Krisl reported the general checking account balance is \$6,273.03 and the Mielke awards account balance is \$4,483.12. Insurance is due in January (\$500). We collected \$338 from ABS raffle. This will be donated to the children's programs at SCA. *(continued)*

- **Board Luncheon:** Linda L Reid will host a lunch at her home for the incoming board with the aim of discussing improvements that can be made to the club programs and shows.
- <u>Venues</u>: Members must visit a venue before signing up and should contact Deni Marrone to sign up. A contract with The Livery is being negotiated. The owners of the new restaurant Campanella, located where the old Flavors used to be, are interested in having a rotating art wall and Deni will be talking with them in the next few weeks.
- Membership: Dues for 2025 have increased to \$45 and should be paid by January 1st.
 Checks written to AWS or cash should be given or mailed to Lorraine Stribling by that date.
 If dues are not paid by January 1st, the member will not be eligible to participate in the Apple Blossom Show.
- <u>Communications</u>: Any member wanting to put up a new artist's web page or who wants to change the artwork on their current web page should contact Gail Mardfin by December 31st.
 Web pages can be changed once a year.


NOVEMBER ART DEMO: Robert Benson

Robert Benson's strong background in art, specifically in watercolor, was on full display in November's demo. He covered his process, tools, and generously responded to multiple questions posed by a rapt audience.

PROCESS

To start, he is a great believer in sketching – he shared sketchbooks showing detailed sketches he makes to work out composition and values. For example, the reference photo used for the demo





He advised that he doesn't want to "trap the eye" – the composition needs to move the viewer into, then around, the painting. ("Just dance around the painting.")

Another key is to move around the painting as he is working, as well as establishing the bright and dark areas early on. He

finds this helps establish a "roadmap" for working. If there is a compositional problem, looking at the painting in a mirror is a good tip to discover the problem areas.

Surprising many, his pencil drawing was very full and detailed. Most often Robert works from his own photos; for complete accuracy, he projects onto paper using an opaque projector and uses a Ticonderoga #2 pencil. Robert noted that he can erase most of the graphite after the painting is dry, but what doesn't come off becomes part of the work. He uses a hair dryer to speed up the drying process.



TOOLS

Paper: Robert prefers Arches 300 lb. rough (cold press) paper – this has a lot of tooth and can take a beating. He recommends working in standard frame sizes to avoid costly professional framing.

Paints: What brands does he use? "All of them," and both tube and pan paints. During the demo, he did reveal some faves: Winsor Newton and especially Holbein. As for colors,

he shies away from staining colors (lifting off can be very difficult) such as Bamboo Green and Bright Rose. For darks, he likes Paynes Gray and Ultramarine Blue. Other colors he favors include Lilac, Lavender, and Shell Pink, colors which would otherwise be hard to achieve. Leaf Green, Shadow Green, Yellow Gray (great for olive trees – "they are not Kelly Green"), Jaune Brilliant, and Horizon Blue are other favorites.

Brushes: He uses various rounds, and flats include 1 ½" and 2" brushes. He noted that they do not need to be expensive; synthetic sables are good.

Buckling Prevention: Best to use 300 lb paper. To remove buckling on thinner paper, he uses a process of wetting the finished painting on the back (except the outer inch or so), laying the painting on particle board (absorbs water), and placing plexiglass on top with weights.

FINISHING

Robert uses various forms of finishing and framing, from the traditional framing under a mat and glass, to varnishing and waxing to eliminate the need for the glass. He also mounts paintings, using gel medium and cradled panels (applied to both the back of the

painting and the board) – he likes the clean look of works finished in this way and it avoids the whole framing debacle.

ARTIST'S BACKGROUND

After graduating from the Art Institute of Pittsburgh in 1975, Robert moved west to Boulder where he worked as an art director for many years. An earlier body of work focused on urban landscapes, many soon to disappear. Moving to Sonoma County in 2001, his focus shifted to Northern California landscapes, still life, and figurative works. He exhibits locally and in Oregon; he is currently featured as a guest artist in the Sebastopol Gallery in downtown Sebastopol. BensonFineArts.com




