March 21 Meeting Demo Artist: Oil painter HUIHAN LIU



Huihan Liu was an instructor and graduate school advisor at the Academy of Art University in San Francisco from 1993-2011. Huihan and his wife Weizhen Liang, who is also a professional painter, moved to Santa Rosa from Kensington, East Bay in 2017. Their work can be seen at huihanweizhenart.com.

Huihan is a Master Signature Member of Oil Painters of America, a Signature Member of California Art Club, and a Master Signature Member of America Impression Society.

Huihan has taught many invitational painting workshops around the country including Fechin Painting Workshop (Taos, NM), Scottsdale Artists' School (Scottsdale, AZ), Fredericksburg Artists School (Fredericksburg, TX), Pixar Studio (Emeryville, CA), and California Art Club (Pasadena), just to name a few. He was an awards juror for the Oil Painters of America National Show in 2015, and several times in other juried venues.

4-7pm to allow for set up of the space. Prices from the Chamber have gone up 50% in two years. They are currently asking \$3300, which we do not have. Bob will negotiate a reduced price with their board. We could possibly save by contracting directly with SCA.

One solution is to try and get money early for ABS entries. The membership will be asked at the meeting to give their checks to Patti and then indicate they have paid early to Lorraine when submitting entries. Fran suggested we have two donation buckets at our Friday reception, one on the wine table and one at raffle/sales table.

Bob discussed other meeting spaces like the Community Center that could save us money. SCA charges the most for meeting rooms of all the Vets buildings he surveyed. We need to talk with their board to discuss issues.

Angel's Plaque: We were going to give Angel a plaque for his dedicated service at the meeting, but Bob discovered he was ill in the hospital. Bob delivered it there and said Angel was very touched by our thinking of him.

<u>Membership</u>: Gary reported we have 78 members with 54 currently eligible for the ABS.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:45 a.m.

How to Measure your Art...

Not everyone knows the proper way to measure artwork, I discovered when receiving members' images for the website. Whether the piece is horizontal or vertical, you <u>always</u> list the measurement as

HEIGHT X WIDTH

I remember it as how you would write a capital **L**

Unless the frame is an integral part of the work itself, its measurements should <u>not</u> be considered in the size of the artwork, just the artwork itself.

The depth, if applicable (such as in James Reynolds' STALLION sculpture shown),



would be listed third: 18x24x8 inches.

2/1/19 AWS Group Critique

Moderated by James Reynolds, this session demonstrated the great body of art wisdom shared amongst our membership. Members presented landscapes, ocean scenes, abstracts, figures, and still lifes depicted in a variety of mediums, including inks and photography. Commentary was respectful, helpful, informative, and supportive.

Concepts of composition, color, brush and paint handling were discussed and ideas shared toward the goal of identifying ways folks could improve their works. Most felt they received feedback that would help them take their work to the next step. In some cases, the group wisdom was: **Don't touch it, it's perfect the way it is.** As always, the artist often needs help to know when his or her masterpiece is in its final form.

She enjoys frequent visits to the local attractions, restaurants, and beautiful scenery of Bodega Bay, accompanied by a black standard poodle named Pearl."

Member Profile with Deni Marrone by Paula Pearce

Paula: So, Deni, where were you born and raised?

Deni: I was born in Los Angeles and raised in the San Fernando Valley until I was 18. I then moved to San Jose with friends to gain my independence.

P: Did you grow up with siblings?

D: Yes, I have one brother three years younger than me.

P: Did you have any family members that were also artists?

D: Yes, matter of fact both my parents were passionate about painting but did not do it for a living. My father was a teacher and my mother was a stay-at-home mom so they had their summers free. When I was about 13, they got summer jobs as counselors at a go-away camp in the Tehachapi Mountains. I wanted to stay back at home with a friend but they insisted I attend the camp for the duration. It turned out to be one of the best summer experiences that I have ever had. I enjoyed hiking and horseback riding to my heart's content. I also gained a newfound respect for my mother, who taught the summer art program.

P: As a child, did you enjoy art?

D: I was very fortunate that my parents allowed me to play in their studio so I had access to all their art supplies like paint and brushes and I loved it.

P: How about when you were in high school? Did you enjoy art?

D: Once I discovered the fluidity of watercolor I was hooked.

P: What happened after high school?

D: After a few years, I met my husband and we settled down in Los Gatos to raise our three children. Our daughter came first followed by her two younger brothers.

P: So your art interest most likely took a back seat, right?

D: Yes, that is true. But years later when our daughter moved to Chico to start college at Chico State, I felt it was my time to go back to school to receive a formal arts education.

P: When did you move up to Sonoma County from Los Gatos?

D: In 2002, we moved to Sebastopol.

P: So where did you enroll in college?

D: I enrolled at Santa Rosa Junior College in 2004. I challenged myself to take every fine arts class that was offered. At the completion I earned not just one, but two fine arts career certifications.

P: How many years did that take you?

D: It took four years because I held down a part time job as a custom framer at Beverley's in Rohnert Park, plus raising our two sons who were ten and eleven by then.

Comment by Paula:, I want to fast forward to your current passion of acrylic pour painting.

P: How did you discover this medium?



D: Approximately two years ago I began my quest to find an art form that was both fluid and abstract.

P: How did you actually learn the techniques required for this unusual art form?

D: After several months of internet tutorials with artists that have mastered this medium, I started to experiment with it and absolutely fell in love with the process and the results. This joy has become my passion and has changed my life.

P: How did you find out about AWS?


D: Before moving to Sonoma County when I was still in Los Gatos, I was a volunteer as an art docent for five local grammar schools there. At that time we received newsletters from Sebastopol Center for the Arts. So when we moved here in 2002, I joined every art association available, including AWS. My past attendance was interrupted by my work schedule until recently when I rejoined AWS and I am so glad I did.

Conclusion by Paula:

Here it is the day after Valentines Day, February 15th, and I was honored to be invited to Deni's lovely home on Cunningham Road. Deni showed me around their spacious home that was beautifully built by her contractor-husband. They have a very rambunctious but friendly Pit Bull named Simba, who spent the whole time under our table on a hardwood floor chewing a bone and dropping it every few seconds. It made it difficult to concentrate but we managed

after all. The weather continued to pour buckets outside, causing waterfalls from the rain gutters overflowing beyond capacity. I also got a tour of Deni's upstairs studio and was amazed by her most recent pour paintings that were still wet in the process. I forgot my camera so Deni used her iPhone camera to capture some amazing images of her artwork. I feel I have made a new friend in Deni and am so glad to share this interview with you all.
