## AWS Zoom Board Minutes April 18, 2020

The meeting was called to order by PRESIDENT Carol Mills at 10:36

Members Present: Carol Mills, Jerry Fabiano, Nancy Sanchietti, Patricia Marina, Gail Mardfin, Gary Caldwell, Fran Nielsen

First order of discussion was regarding rent already paid to SCA for meetings not held due to Corona virus. It was decided that reimbursement will not be requested for prepaid meetings. When further rent becomes due, the board will decide at that time whether to continue to pay rent to SCA depending on whether or not current restrictions on gathering are still in place.

Fran reported that ART AT THE SOURCE and ART TRAILS will be held together as a virtual tour the first two weekends of September. More info to follow.

VICE PRESIDENT Jerry Fabiano suggested that mini demos online may be something we can do to keep our members interested and enthused about art. He said that he would follow up with the two demo artists he had cancelled due to the virus and see if they could do virtual demos. Nancy suggested that we could recommend online youtube demos that we could watch in the different mediums and discuss afterward. Jerry said he would ask members to give youtube

The next AWS MEETING will be held on May 21st, via ZOOM and Gail will send instructions to members inviting them to join in the meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 12 noon by Pres Carol.

There are still "virtual" art shows. SCA is having a Favorite Things exhibition, for instance, and I know several of you entered.





Below: "And then SHE said" 11x14 watercolor




#### From the Editor

#### **Good Books from Dante**



Dear AWS Friends.

Like all of you I am taking in fresh information daily about the covid trend lines and the number of reported cases. There has never been a world-wide event of this magnitude before. And yet there are some pretty solid statistics available that can help us plan our AWS activities for the next 6, 12 or 18 months.

The quarantine measures which most of us are practicing should help to reduce the number of covid cases significantly. However having 50 or 60 mostly senior citizens in close quarters for three hours and sharing food is a high risk activity. We are a particularly vulnerable population and I would feel terrible if one or more of our friends became ill or worse as a result of our gathering. A vaccine is not expected to be developed and widely disseminated until possibly the later part of 2021. To me this recommends a month by month approach with the expectation that it might not be prudent to begin normal meeting activities for many months.

Personal one on one cards, phone calls, text and email messages exchanged among all members is always helpful. Zoom and Skype meetings work very well and some of us might be willing to




